## Write A News Report:

Write a news report about the main event that takes place in the first two chapters of the novel. Create a captivating headline. Begin your story with a one-paragraph lead that summarizes who, what, where, when, why, and how the event occurred. Each subsequent paragraph in the rest of the report should contain descriptive adjectives. Build these paragraphs around details taken directly from the book. Include interviews of police and fire Marshalls as well as of the novel's other characters who can provide eyewitness testimony, quotations, etc. These quotes should reflect the opinions and biases of the people interviewed. Provide a photo that you can find off the internet (not the one seen on the novel cover) that would suit your story; and give the photo a caption. Finally, make your news report balanced. You should include what others know or suspect about the event that differ from certain eyewitnesses or expert opinions. Your story should take up at least 3/4 of a page (size 12 font) and for Level 4 marks, make it appear in columns when you type it.

**Provide planning sheets for your news report:** Show that you planned out what quotes you would include and from whom, what some possible headlines could be, what all the facts would be that you would include in the story, and what kind of images would be possible to go with the story.
