



What information does Firefox collect about me?

Your operating system, IP address, Firefox version, buttons or ads you click, language preferences and length of browsing sessions.

Mozilla will use physical, business and technical security measures to protect your personally-identifying information. It will notify you in the event of a security breach. It will only keep your information for as long as it is needed, then destroy it.

What happens to feedback I provide to Mozilla?

Mozilla can distribute it, publish it on its websites and use it to improve its products.

Why and with whom might Firefox share my information?

Only with Mozilla-approved data handlers that provide its services.

Firefox may also publish your information and does not guarantee that it will not disclose personally-identifying information.

Firefox will share your data when legally required by governments or courts.

Firefox will tell you if it complies with such a request.

It will also share your information to protect the rights, property or safety of you, other users, Mozilla or the public.

Your search history will be owned by whichever search engine you select.

Firefox may share your information if another company takes it over.

What laws control my use of Firefox?

The laws of California, U.S.A.

Mozilla can change Firefox's EULA without notifying you.

If you continue to use Firefox, Mozilla assumes that you agree to the new policy.

How can I use Firefox?

You can use, reproduce, make available, modify, patent, display, perform, distribute, and otherwise exploit any version.

You cannot use any Firefox trademarks, name or logo, and must distribute using the Mozilla Public License.

What happens if something goes wrong with a Firefox feature?

Mozilla does not guarantee that its special features are 100% accurate or comprehensive.

Mozilla will compensate you a maximum of US\$500.

This compensation may not be applicable depending on your local laws.
