



What information is collected and how is it used?

Your location, Facebook profile, email address, interests, likes, gender, birthday, education, relationship interests, current city, photos, personal description, information about friends. Tinder tracks your browsing unless you opt out at <http://www.aboutads.info/choices/> Tinder can sell, distribute, reproduce, or modify your content. Tinder can conduct criminal background checks or screenings.

Who cannot use Tinder?

People <13, felons and sex offenders.

What laws control my use of Tinder?

If you use Tinder in Canada, the laws of Canada. Because your info is stored on Tinder's servers, US Homeland security.

What happens to my information if Tinder merges or gets bought out?

All your information and rights will belong to the new owners.

What if my use causes quarrels or crimes?

Tinder does neither background checks nor verifies statements. Tinder can suspend your account at any time for any reason and doesn't have to tell you why. Tinder can't be held responsible for any losses and damages resulting from communication or meetings.

What am I allowed and not allowed to do on Tinder?

You may only make personal-not commercial-use. You must tell (help@gotinder.com) of any unauthorized use of your username, password or any other security breach. You may not send anything offensive, inaccurate, incomplete, illegal, abusive, obscene, profane, threatening, racist, violent, impersonating, stalking, intimidating, harassing, soliciting, or any material that infringes or violates another's rights.

With whom might Tinder share my information?

- other users
- ad trackers, analytics, surveys, contests
- other Match group members (dating sites)
- advertisers
- investors
- law enforcement

Can I stop Tinder from using my content?

If you close your account, Tinder will retain info for analytical purposes and recordkeeping. If your info has already been given to third parties, they will retain it too.

What are my legal rights?

Tinder does not promise to be secure or error-free. At no time can any class action be taken. Any claim or action will be settled by binding arbitration-in any suitable location- through the American Arbitration Association. You give up your right to go to court other than small-claims. Any claim or action must be filed in court within 1 year of the incident. Proceedings must take place in and under the laws of Dallas County, Texas.
